## **Quick Facts:**

- Since 1996, CURE has performed more than 84,000 surgeries and seen more than 1.3 million patients.
- CURE International is the largest provider of pediatric specialty surgical care in the developing world. Its hospitals specialize primarily in treating children with orthopedic and neurosurgical conditions such as hydrocephalus, cleft palate and clubfoot.
- CURE International operates 11 hospitals in Afghanistan, the Dominican Republic, Ethiopia, Honduras, Kenya, Malawi, Niger, Uganda, the United Arab Emirates and Zambia.
- CURE International launched CURE Clubfoot Worldwide in 2006 to eliminate clubfoot as a lifelong disability in the developing world. More than 10,000 children have been treated so far.
- CURE International was founded by Dr. Scott and Sally Harrison in 1996 as a result of the intense need for medical care and healing they witnessed in their travels to developing nations. The organization's first hospital opened in Kenya in 1998.
- CURE International has provided specialized training in orthopedics, neurology and other medical disciplines to more than 600 national medical professionals.
- CURE International incorporates a faith component into its overall care program that's culturally relevant and sensitive to its patients.
- CURE International has been given a four-star rating from Charity Navigator – the highest rating given to a nonprofit organization to show exceptional financial management – for seven consecutive years.
