AIC-CURE International Children's Hospital Kijabe, Kenya

Overview: AIC-CURE was CURE International's first hospital. More importantly, it has the distinction of being Africa's first orthopedic/pediatric teaching hospital for physically disabled children. More than 10 years after its opening, the hospital stands out as one of Africa's premier medical institutions, both due to the high quality and expertise of its medical care as well as the contributions its orthopedic training program makes to increasing the number of orthopedic surgeons on the continent. The hospital also increases its reach by sending out mobile clinics to other areas of the country to provide follow-up care and to identify more children who are in need of treatment.

CURE Children's Hospital of Uganda Mbale, Uganda

Overview: The CURE Children's Hospital of Uganda specializes in treating the neurosurgical needs of children with an emphasis on hydrocephalus, neural tube defects, spina bifida, epilepsy and brain tumors. CURE Uganda also maintains a large outpatient clinic and operates monthly mobile clinics in remote regions. The hospital is known worldwide for its pioneering work in the treatment of hydrocephalus. Its training programs attract medical professionals from all over the world.

Beit CURE International Hospital Blantyre, Malawi

Overview: CURE Malawi specializes in the treatment of a wide range of orthopedic conditions including clubfoot, burn contractures, osteomyelitis and other acquired or congenital conditions. The CURE hospital also provides physiotherapy and chiropractic services. Monthly mobile clinics are sent to remote areas to identify children who can be served by the hospital and to provide follow-up care to those who have received surgery. Its orthopedic clinical officer training program has been recognized by Malawi's government as a vital contributor to the country's medical infrastructure.

CURE Dominican Republic Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic

Overview: Located in downtown Santo Domingo, the CURE Dominican Republic hospital offers inpatient surgical and rehabilitative care to disabled children. It was CURE International's first hospital in Latin America. The hospital has established a satellite clinic in the neighboring country of Haiti to provide outreach, referral and follow-up services to the local community and Haitian refugees who have settled in this area.

CURE International Hospital of Kabul/ CURE International Family Health Center Kabul, Afghanistan

Overview: Early in 2005, the Afghan Health Consortium invited CURE International to assume control of both a family health clinic and a hospital partially restored by the Coalition Forces. By the end of 2005, both facilities were fully operational. These facilities specialize in general surgery, obstetrics, gynecology and orthopedics as well as maternity and neonatal intensive care. As Afghanistan is one of the most heavily mined countries in the world, and its people severely injured by war, a great need existed for orthopedic services and training. CURE Kabul has received numerous accolades for its services from the Afghan Ministry of Health. Its numerous training programs have received international attention and have contributed to improving health care access for Afghans.

Oasis Hospital Al Ain, United Arab Emirates

A main focus of care at the hospital is centered on maternal and infant health, but a variety of other services are available to men, women and children. A new hospital building is currently under construction.

Beit CURE Hospital of Zambia Lusaka, Zambia

Overview: CURE International signed an agreement with the Zambian Ministry of Health to establish and operate the Beit CURE Hospital of Zambia in 2006. The government of Zambia also generously donated 60 acres of land for construction of the hospital. CURE Zambia is one of the few hospitals in the country that can adequately address the surgical needs of Zambia's children with physical disabilities, and it specializes in pediatric orthopedic surgery as well as neurosurgery.

CURE Ethiopia Children's Hospital Addis Ababa, Ethiopia

Overview: CURE Ethiopia Children's Hospital is the country's only pediatric specialty surgical hospital delivering care to the country's disabled children. The facility features modern, up-to-date standards and equipment. It treats disabilities such as cleft lip and palate, clubfoot, burn contractures and other physical disabilities.

CURE Honduras Pediatric Orthopedic Hospital San Pedro Sula, Honduras

Overview: CURE International opened the CURE Honduras Pediatric Orthopedic Hospital in San Pedro Sula in early 2009. This 20-bed facility is the country's first and only nonprofit hospital that specializes in pediatric orthopedics. The hospital also sends mobile clinics to remote areas of the country. CURE International first established a presence in Honduras in 2004 when it began providing medical care for disabled children in San Pedro Sula through clinics at a local government hospital.
